#### Yarra Ranges Technical School Opening Ceremony

I had the honour of attending the opening of the Yarra Ranges Technical School (Box Hill Institute) on Friday, 14 October. Minister James Merlino officially opened the complex which will begin to trial Science, Technology and Engineering programs for Year 8 students from December of this year. Lilydale Heights College has been active in support of the design and planning of programs which will operate out of the Tech in 2017.

#### Leadership and Collaborative Opportunities

Leadership and collaborative skills can be developed in many ways and take on different forms for individual students. These skills are listed as essential requirements for success in future employment for young people today. In recent weeks many of our students have had the opportunity to showcase and/or develop their leadership and collaborative skills in a variety of ways:

- The Senior VCAL class has completed a month-long project that raises awareness for those less fortunate in our communities. Working together, these exceptional young students coordinated a series of events which provided the College and wider school community with opportunities to assist agencies such as: Beyond Blue, Redwood Community Centre, Holy Fools, Yarra Valley Care Bags and indigenous gardens. We are very proud of the efforts and community awareness displayed by these young adults. Well done to our VCAL group of 2016 and their teachers, Ms Byrne, Mrs Logan and Mrs Riazati.
- Two of our students represented the College and their community at the Bushfire Forum. Beaudon Nash and Jamie Elliott attended a series of workshops where students discussed and presented their perspectives on the importance of awareness and prevention.
- The Rotary Club of Lilydale sponsored two of our Year 10 students to attend a weekend leadership camp. Lisa Breslin and Alisha Harrison were a part of the RYPEN leadership camp held at the Oasis Camp in Mt Evelyn. Here they worked with other like minded teenagers from around the state to develop self confidence, understanding and presentation skills. We thank Rotary for their support.
- The Summit Camp sponsored six of our Year 10 and 11 students to attend a weekend leadership camp. This group of students completed personal challenges, team work activities and resilience tasks in an effort to identify their strengths but also to challenge their thinking and appreciate the powers of working as a collective. Thank you to Mrs Riazati for accessing this opportunity for our students.
- Year 10 Market Day was held on Friday, 14 October. Students from Year 10 worked in teams to research, plan and run a small business. The variety of choices ranged from car wash and fairy floss, to lollies and cake, and the inevitable sausage sizzle. This was an authentic learning opportunity. Profits from the day were donated to local charities. We would like to acknowledge Coles in Lilydale for donating 50 cans of drinks and Domino's contribution of all the pizza boxes. Well done to all the students involved and to Mrs Riazati and Ms Middlemast for their commitment to the success of the program.

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#### VCE Creative Arts Show and Exhibition

Many of our senior students have now completed their folio work in VCE Studio Art, Music Performance & Theatre Studies. Students, staff, parents and friends were brilliantly entertained and impressed by the theatrical performances, art and technology folios and individual musical renditions held at the VCE Creative Arts Showcase. This work is the culmination of year-long processes and form a significant part of the students' assessment for their subject.

The Studio Art students also had the additional honour of being able to have their works displayed publicly at Chirnside Park over a two-week period. The Yarra Ranges Council, through Kimberley Place Community Centre, gave our College access to the old Dick Smith store. Head of Arts, Mrs Laura Morley, aided by Anne Wilkins, transformed the facility into an art galley. The opening night was a great success and the exhibition was an opportunity for students to showcase their talents and represent the school in the community. Well done all.

Complementing this was the College's musical End Of Year Showcase held at the Karralyka Centre on Monday, 24 October. This well attended event is the culmination of an outstanding amount of work, preparation and practice undertaken by the Music students at the College. 
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#### Sports

## **Literacy Improvement Plan**

The Lilydale Heights Literacy Team has recently completed a professional development course in leading whole-school literacy improvement, run by the Bastow Institute of Educational Leadership.

College Literacy Leaders, Lara Serle and Mathew Smith, along with Literacy Team members, Peter McKenzie and Tim Chapman, have used this opportunity to develop a Whole-school Literacy Improvement Plan that will involve a number of initiatives around reading, writing and vocabulary. These initiatives will be introduced, consolidated and finally embedded in every classroom over the next five years. This plan will drive ongoing improvement in literacy outcomes for Lilydale Heights students.

The first improvement strategy has already begun with the Independent Reading Program running at the Junior School. This program ensures that students are engaged in reading a text of their choice every day, based on clear evidence that time spent engaged in reading leads to improvement in reading comprehension, writing, spelling and vocabulary.

In Term 4 this program has been extended into the Middle School. Students in Middle School were informed that they were to bring a text of their choice to class on the first day back for Term 4. This could be a novel, non-fiction book, magazine, or other text chosen by the student, either from the College Library or outside the school.

Finally, we have also introduced a second initiative, aimed at improving student writing, through the use of Writing to Learn (WTL) strategies. These are strategies used within the classroom to engage students in low-stakes, informal writing. Through the use of these strategies, students write more frequently, clarify their thinking about topics and concepts learned in class, and improve their ability to communicate their knowledge and understanding through writing.

The Whole-school Literacy Improvement Plan is complemented by literacy support programs. These programs are aimed at breaking the cycle of low confidence and low understanding in reading among some students. These programs include QuickSmart Literacy and programs developed and tailored for individual students by the College Literacy Leaders.

After some excellent NAPLAN results this year, showing that our Year 9 students have made a strong improvement in reading and writing since Year 7, it will be exciting to see further evidence of student success in coming years.

## Life at Limitless

During the holidays, from Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> to Monday 26<sup>th</sup>September, six of us, including myself, were lucky enough to experience the best four days of our lives at Limitless Camp. Limitless Camp is a Personal Development camp run by Ryan and Melissa Doughty (parents of five children and owners of The Summit Camp). Ryan and Mel donate more than \$200,000 to provide a free camp that helps inspire 400 young people to find their greatness! The Impact Project is a registered charity, supported by the incredible team at The Summit Camp.

This experience was one of the greatest that I had ever embarked upon. The memories I have developed and friendships I have made, I will remember for the rest of my life. Every moment of the four days was one in which I feel deeply privileged to have attended. Thank you to our parents for driving us to camp and back, washing our muddy clothes and not complaining once. **Janvi Beri** 


# Japan Tour






